after 1435 and labelled chancery standard provided the mechanism by which this supposedly midlands variety spread out from london this set of explanations is challenged by taking a multilingual perspective examining anglo norman french medieval latin and mixed language contexts as well as monolingual english ones by analysing local and legal documents mercantile accounts personal letters and journals medical and religious prose multiply copied works and the output of individual scribes standardisation is shown to have been preceded by supralocalisation rather than imposed top down as a single entity by governmental authority linguistic features examined include syntax morphology vocabulary spelling letter graphs abbreviations and suspensions social context and discourse norms

pragmatics registers text types communities of practice social networks and the multilingual backdrop which was influenced by shifting socioeconomic trends this collection brings together perspectives everyday multilingual identities integrating related fields of family discourse family language socialization and family language policy unifies ways of understanding the intersections of kinship and language the analyses in this book provide insight into multilingual family experiences children s language development and societal level language maintenance and shift in the eighteenth century the british empire pursued its commercial ambitions across the globe greatly expanding its colonial presence and with it the reach of the english language during this era a standard form of english was taught in the british provinces just as it was increasingly exported from the british isles to colonial outposts in north america the caribbean south asia oceania and west africa under these conditions a monolingual politics of standard english came to obscure other forms of multilingual and dialect writing forms of writing that were made to appear as inferior provincial or foreign oddities daniel dewispelare s multilingual subjects at once documents how different varieties of english became sidelined as dialects and asserts the importance of both multilingualism and dialect writing to eighteenth century anglophone culture by looking at the lives of a variety of multilingual and nonstandard speakers and writers who have rarely been discussed together individuals ranging from slaves and indentured servants to translators rural dialect speakers and others dewispelare suggests that these language practices were tremendously valuable to the development of anglophone literary aesthetics even as standard english became dominant throughout the ever expanding english speaking world offering a prehistory of globalization especially in relation to language practices and politics multilingual subjects foregrounds the linguistic multiplicities of the past and examines the way these have been circumscribed through standardized forms of literacy in the process dewispelare seeks to make sense of a present in which linguistic normativity plays an important role in determining both what forms of writing are aesthetically valued and what types of speakers and writers are viewed as full fledged bearers of political rights this book explores the differing ways in which language has been used to try to make sense of the first world war offering further

developments in an innovative approach to the study of the conflict it develops a transnational viewpoint of the experience of war to reveal less expected areas of language use during the conflict taking the study of the first world war far beyond the western front chapters examine experiences in many regions including africa armenia post war australia russia and estonia and a variety of multilingual writing research that is significant yet underexplored in applied linguistics tesol and literacy studies during the past decades literacy has gradually become a major concern all over the world though there is a great diversity in both the distribution and degree of literacy in different countries there has been an increasing awareness of the number of illiterates and the consequences of being illiterate however literacy is no longer seen as a universal trait when one focuses on culturally sensitive accounts of reading and writing practices the concept of literacy as a single trait does not seem very feasible a multiplicity of literacy practices can be distinguished which are related to specific cultural contexts and associated with relations of power

and ideology as such literacy can be seen as a lifelong context bound set of practices in which an individual's needs vary with time and place this volume explores the use of literacy outside the mainstream in different contexts throughout the world it is divided into four sections section 1 presents an anthropological perspective analyzing the society and the individual in a society section 2 presents a psychological perspective focusing on the individuals themselves and analyzing the cognitive and affective development of young children as they acquire literacy in their first and second languages section 3 presents an educational perspective highlighting the variations in educational approaches in different societies as well as the outcomes of these approaches section 4 summarizes the studies presented in this volume both theoretical issues and educational implications related to the development of literacy in two languages are discussed an attempt is also made to open up new directions in the study of literacy development in multilingual contexts by bringing these various disciplinary perspectives together multilingual encounters have been commonplace in many types of institutions and have become an essential part of supranational institutions such as the eu since their inception this volume explores and discusses different ways of researching the discursive dimension of these encounters and critically examines their relevance to policy politics and society as a whole this includes institutions at the local regional and supranational level multilingualism of nuclear particles are discussed along with nuclear forces and potentials and scattering and reaction models employed in nuclear physics the nuclear structure and models of the nucleus are also considered comprised of four chapters this volume begins with a review of the characteristics of nucleons and other particles that play a role in nuclear interaction processes in order to gain further insight into the underlying physical problems neutron physics antinucleons deuteron physics and two body nuclear forces are highlighted together with three and four nucleon systems and heavy ion physics the next three chapters deal with nuclear forces and potentials as deduced from nuclear dynamics scattering and polarization scattering and reaction models used in nuclear physics and nuclear models such as the shell model models of deformed nuclei and many body self consistent models the book concludes with an analysis of the brueckner bethe goldstone theory of nuclear matter this book
